### Important Weather-Related Information:

The Town of Pike Road is working closely with the Montgomery County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) to monitor severe weather conditions. Due to predicted severe weather, the Town of Pike Road will be closing Town Hall and other municipal facilities at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, March 17. Town Hall and municipal facilities will reopen on Thursday, March 18.

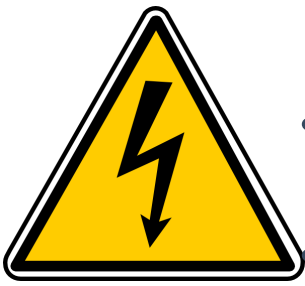
In addition, Pike Road Schools will operate on a two-hour delay on Thursday, Mar. 18. Please monitor Pike Road Schools' communication systems for status updates. [Click here to visit Pike Road Schools online.](#)

With the strong storms forecast to arrive this afternoon and overnight, the risks include strong winds, heavy rain, frequent lightning, hail, and tornadoes. Please be sure you have several ways to receive emergency notifications, such as a weather radio and smartphone apps from our local providers. 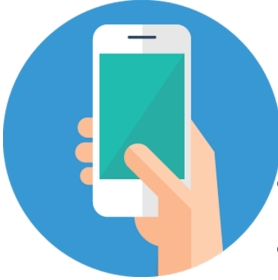
Once again, we encourage you to tune in to our local news and weather providers for updates on the approaching weather system. Remember to call 911 in case of an emergency.
