Holiday Reminders:

- Town Hall will close at noon on Tuesday, Dec. 31 and remain closed Wednesday, Jan. 1, in observance of the New Year's holiday. We will reopen with regular hours on Thursday, Jan. 2.
- AmWaste, our sanitation service partner, has provided the following holiday schedule: Trash pickup will run as scheduled on Monday and Tuesday, Dec. 30 & 31. There will be no pickup on Wednesday, Jan. 1, and from Wednesday forward, all routes will be serviced on a one-day delay.
 - Wednesday routes will be serviced on Thursday, Thursday routes on Friday, and so on through Saturday, Jan. 4.

Christmas Tree Recycling Begins at Town Hall Today!

Christmas trees are the center of so many holiday memories, but what do you do with them when Christmas has passed?

There is a designated Christmas Tree Recycling area in the parking lot of Town Hall (9575 Vaughn Rd) from Dec. 27 - Jan. 7 for Pike Road residents to drop off their undecorated, live trees. Thank you in advance for helping us keep this area free of trash and full of trees!



For the disposal of artificial trees or other waste items, we encourage you to utilize the monthly County Cleanup Days, provided by the Montgomery County Commission. On the last Saturday of each month, unless otherwise noted, receptacles are available at the Pike Road Schools Georgia Washington Campus (696 Georgia Washington Rd) and the County Lot Office (across from The Feed Lot on Meriwether Road) for free garbage drop-off from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. The next County Cleanup Day will be tomorrow, Dec. 28.

The new year brings new topics for the Ag & Stewardship Seminar Series! Join us for the first event of 2020: David Russell, of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System, will lead the Jan. 10 <u>Early Start Weed Control Seminar</u>, to be held from 9 - 11 a.m. at Pike Road Founders Station (4902 Pike Rd).

This seminar will benefit those with pastureland, hunting land, and residential lawns. We'll discuss topics including preparation for planting, preemptive weed-control measures, uses for roundup and other herbicides, and toxic plants that pose health risks for livestock.

This is a free event, but registration is required.

Jan. 12: Poured Paint Art Workshop - Register Now!


