Don't wait - the time to prepare for healthy lawns and pastures is now! On Friday, Jan. 10, David Russell of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System will lead an Early Start Weed Control Seminar from 9 - 11 a.m. at Pike Road Founders Station (4902 Pike Rd) to help you get started.

This seminar - the first Ag & Stewardship event of 2020 - is great for tending to pastureland, hunting land, and residential lawns. We'll discuss topics including preparation for planting, preemptive weed-control measures, uses for roundup and other herbicides, and toxic plants that pose health risks for livestock.


