Your dedication to making smart decisions has helped keep our community safe and healthy while building the confidence that has helped us enjoy more opportunities as we move forward.

The current Safer Apart Order for Alabama means that masks are no longer mandated, but we all have the opportunity and responsibility to make smart, responsible decisions that help keep our community healthy. The same simple, healthy precautions we have been practicing can help: Practice 6-foot social distancing, frequent and thorough handwashing, understand the risks of crowds, and consider wearing a face mask in public spaces and around those outside of your household. The Town, for the immediate future, will continue to require visitors to wear masks when visiting public buildings. Further, we encourage all of our residents to honor the requests of individual businesses and organizations throughout Pike Road as relates to COVID-19 practices and precautions. 


